Slippery Rock University's Master of Arts in English degree provides a 10-month full-time and a 20-month part-time course rotation in the English disciplines of writing. Students specialize in the study of writing produced in any discipline or profession. The program contains ten courses completed sequentially, but allows an applicant to focus on an area of interest.

The Master of Arts in English prepares students for writing in fields such as business, education, government, law, nonprofit administration, translation, and technical writing. The program also welcomes teachers of English who seek to continue their education or prepare for futher graduate study.
