ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Slippery Rock University's Master of Music Therapy program is designed to prepare advanced-level professional music therapists in a nationally accredited program to work in the rapidly-expanding field of music therapy by providing students with the opportunity to expand the breadth and depth of their knowledge and skills in music therapy.

The Master of Music Therapy program with a counseling concentration will prepare graduates to have:

- 1. Advanced knowledge of, and skills in, music therapy theory, research, and clinical practice
- 2. Advanced musical and artistic skills for music therapy
- 3. Awareness of personal, cultural, and social factors that impact the therapeutic relationship
- 4. An in-depth understanding of the professional role of the music therapist

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Slippery Rock University's Master of Music Therapy offers:

- A 36-48 credit hour program with a two-year rotating curriculum
- Students completing the 48 credit MMT are eligible to complete the Clinical Mental Health Counseling endorsement program at SRU which will take an additional year
- A flexible and convenient hybrid format (interactive synchronous and asynchronous online classes and face-to-face intensives either attended in-person or virtually) ideal for working professionals and second career musicians
- Unique advanced music therapy training with a strong emphasis on culture, diversity, ethics, and social justice throughout the curriculum
- Courses taught by distinguished internationally recognized faculty
- SRU's Master of Music Therapy is approved by the American Music Therapy Association (AMTA) and National Association of Schools of Music (NASM).

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE CERTIFICATION

SRU's Music Therapy program is approved by the American Music Therapy Association and the National Association of Schools of Music. Pennsylvania does not require state licensing; however, some states do require licensing for music therapists. If you are interested in practicing in another state, please contact the licensing board in that state.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must submit the following materials along with a completed online graduate application and a non-refundable application fee:

- Applicants to the Master of Music Therapy program must have completed a bachelor's degree in music therapy (with a GPA of 3.00 or higher), including an internship in an approved program, or have completed a music therapy equivalency program, including completion of a music therapy internship.
- Applicants without an undergraduate degree in music therapy or its equivalence can complete the necessary coursework, on-campus or through distance learning, and internship requirements for music therapy board certification through SRU prior to the MMT coursework.
- 3. Official undergraduate degree transcript(s) and any graduate transcripts.
- 4. Resume
- 5. Personal Statement statement of Professional Goals
- 6. A video-recording of three songs accompanied on piano and three songs accompanied on guitar. On each instrument, there must be one song appropriate for children, one for adolescents or adults, and one for older adults. Video-recording may be submitted by YouTube links, Google Drive or <u>Dropbox.com</u> and links emailed to <u>graduate.admissions@sru.edu.</u>
- 7. A synchronous video interview with the MMT program director. Interviews will be scheduled after all other application materials have been filed.

Applicants who do not meet all of the criteria, but who have demonstrated effectiveness in the field, may be offered conditional admission upon recommendation of the MMT program director and approval by the Director of Graduate Admissions. Admission to the program will not require the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or other entrance exam, which will facilitate enrollment by adult learners.
