

RACC to SRU – Transfer Credit Guide

This guide corresponds with the Rock Studies component (general education) of the SRU curricula and provides RACC course suggestions for each area. Because this guide is generic, students should review their RACC course plans with an <u>SRU transfer counselor</u>, as some majors may prescribe specific courses in the categories below.
