Psychology majors study normal, abnormal and social behavior from a scientific perspective. Students are required to master core areas of the field such as developmental, social and physiological psychology, and develop research skills through methods classes such as statistics and experimental psychology. B.S. students are required to complete a competency requirement consisting of a community service practicum, research project or internship. Additional courses in the major, such as criminal behavior or psychology of aging, are selected by the student to reflect their individual professional interests and career goals.

Psychology graduates routinely obtain employment in social or human service agencies and research organizations. Many pursue graduate education in the field to prepare for professional careers in academic, clinical or counseling areas, and others enter related professional training such as law or medical school.
