- Send CD with up to three works in PowerPoint format for consideration. You may submit up to three images per piece.
- Include an inventory list with title, medium, date, size and email address for notification
- Also send on CD high resolution jpeg images for a catalogue that will accompany the exhibit, advertising and publication brochures.
- Works cannot exceed a shipping weight of 40 lbs. and must be able to fit through a door 80" x 55."
- Artists are responsible for shipping costs to and from the gallery.
- Works will be insured on SRU campus.

Leona Shanks currently paints, studies and teaches at Studio Incamminati in Philadelphia, which she co-founded with Nelson Shanks. In 2013, at Dacia Gallery in New York City, Shanks unveiled "Searching the Soul," a solo exhibition of women figurative paintings. In 2010, Shanks received First Place Award: Inspiring Figures: American Women and Figurative Art Competition, at the Butler Institute of Contemporary Art. In 2002, she was awarded First Place, Edmund Stewardson Award for Sculpture at PAFA. Shanks exhibits her work nationally in Los Angeles, Calif., Las Vegas, Nev., and Santa Fe, N.M. to name a few.
