NURSING PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Accredited by Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)

- Nursing Core consists of 30 online credit hours
- Nursing courses are primarily delivered in eight-week sessions for maximum flexibility for working nurses completing the program.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Valid, unencumbered RN license. (Graduate Nurses, pending licensure, may be eligible for provisional admissions.)
- Good Academic standing at last institution attended
- Minimum 63 non-remedial college-level transfer credits
 - Official transcript from each institution, from which earnedcredits

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must meet all Graduation Requirements as delineated in the University catalog, including the following requirements that should be considered as students are transferring credits and choosing SRU coursework.

- Students must complete 48 credits of upper-level coursework. Thirty-nine of the 48 credits must be at the 300 level or higher; the additional 9 credits may include courses requiring a 3-credit prerequisite. At least 24 of 48 credits must be completed at SRU.
- GPA Requirements 2.0 or higher Overall GPA
