

## DCCC to SRU - Transfer Credit Guide

This guide corresponds with the Rock Studies component (general education) of the SRU curricula and provides DCCC course suggestions for each area. Because this guide is generic, students should review their DCCC course plans with an <a href="SRU transfer counselor">SRU transfer counselor</a>, as some majors may prescribe specific courses in the categories below.

Those pursuing a Program-to-Program Articulation agreement (P2P) or an individual articulation agreement with DCCC should follow that specific associate degree curriculum, not this guide.
