### What is Dating Violence?

Violence by a person who has been in a romantic or intimate relationship with the victim. (VAWA SaVE Act 2013)

# Statistics on Dating Violence/Abuse:

- •Approximately 70% of college students say they have been sexually coerced.
- •Girls and young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence -- almost triple the national average.
- •Violent behavior typically begins between the ages of 12 and 18. (<u>www.loveisrespect.org</u>, National Dating Abuse Helpline)

## Red Flags for Dating Violence/Abuse:

- •Checking partner's cell phone or email without permission
- Constantly putting partner down
- Extreme jealousy or insecurity
- Explosive temper
- •Isolating partner from family or friends
- Making false accusations
- Mood swings
- Physically hurting partner in any way
- Possessiveness
- •Telling partner what to do
- •Repeatedly pressuring partner to have sex (Adapted from www.loveisrespect.org, National Dating Abuse Helpline)
