

SRU's council of trustees to host Presidential Search town hall meeting April 13

SLIPPERY ROCK, Pa. – The Slippery Rock University council of trustees will solicit input from members of the University community about the selection of SRU's next president at a town hall meeting at 3:30 p.m., April 13 in Room 111 of the Spotts World Culture Building. All SRU students, faculty and staff are encouraged to attend.

"We want to hear directly from the SRU community as we begin our search for an outstanding leader who can continue to guide our University along its upward trajectory," said Jeff Smith, chair of the SRU Presidential Search Committee. "Those that study, teach and work at the University can provide key insights as part of this process and their opinions are valued by this committee."

At the town hall meeting, participants will have the opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback about the search, offer suggestions about the opportunities and challenges facing SRU's next president, and discuss the skills and attributes they feel the next president should possess.

Members of the Presidential Search Committee as well as JoAnn Gora, consultant and former president of Ball State University, from AGB Search, the firm retained to assist in finding a successor to SRU President Cheryl Norton, will be on hand.

The COT launched the Presidential Search process in December after Norton, who was appointed as the 16th – and first female – president of SRU in 2012, announced her retirement from the University, effective July 21, 2017.
