FEATURE STORY

THE MAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND – DR. JOSEPH CALI

After 36 years of dedicated service at Slippery Rock University, Dr. Joseph Cali announced his retirement in the Spring of 2025. Since taking the reins of the current Safety Management program in 1989, he saw the program grow from approximately 50 students to over 400 students currently enrolled (2025). The maximum enrollment of safety majors under Dr. Cali was 520 students in 2018.

Dr. Cali graduated from Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) in 1974 with an undergraduate degree in Criminology. After graduation, he took his first job as a loss control representative at Hills Department Store. During his time at Hills, Dr. Cali realized the importance of safety and security in the workplace. He began his master's degree in criminology at IUP in 1977 and was ultimately hired to teach security classes.

After completing his master's degree, Dr. Cali enrolled in a doctorate at West Virginia University in Safety Studies/Management. He was really interested in Safety Management, and while at WVU, he worked as a graduate assistant. As a graduate assistant, he took on multiple small jobs while living in a local motel to save money. He also taught one course in the spring semester of his first year at WVU. He eventually accepted a position as a lecturer and taught for two years full-time while at WVU.

While at WVU, Dr. Cali was a student of Dr. C. Everett Marcum, who was considered by many to be a prolific scholar in the safety profession. Dr. Marcum was also a pioneer in the safety profession who coined the term "Misactsident" and revised the Domino Theory of Accidents. The Domino Theory focuses on the events leading to an accident and on management errors. Dr. Cali mentioned, "Dr. Marcum was a genius; he never reprimanded you but guided you." Dr. Marcum's teaching style focused on the management principles of safety management but also incorporated the technical aspects as well.

Dr. Marcum remained a very influential person in Dr. Cali's life, along with Dr. George Mihalik, serving as chair on both of their dissertation committees while at WVU. Dr. Cali and Dr. Mihalik became close friends while at WVU, building a strong bond that remains today after

almost 50 years. Today, Dr. Cali and Dr. Mihalik are considered the forefathers of the safety management program at SRU. They both built a successful safety program culture and highly respected reputation at SRU, similar to what Dr. Marcum established in the Department of Safety Studies at WVU over 50 years ago.

After finishing his doctoral work at WVU, Dr. Cali returned to IUP and accepted a full-time temporary faculty position in the Criminology Department. He also consulted at the Beaver Nuclear facility, mostly around items pertaining to emergency management. He also taught briefly in the Criminal Justice Department at Salem College.

A few years after his tenure at Salem College, Dr. Cali accepted a job with the City of Pittsburgh as a Senior Research Analyst. During this time, the position of Safety and Inspections Manager became available, and he applied and accepted it within the Department of Public Safety. The department consisted of police, fire, EMS, and inspections. His supervisor at the time resigned, and Dr. Cali took on the role and responsibility for the entire city, with a staff of only four. He reported directly to Glenn Cannon, who was the Director of Public Safety for the City of Pittsburgh.

In the spring of 1989, Dr. George Mihalik called Dr. Cali, notifying him of a safety faculty position at Slippery Rock University in the Allied Health Department. The Safety Management program

at Slippery Rock University began in 1982. Dr. Mihalik, already teaching and working as the head football coach, realized that he needed somebody to lead the program into the future. The person he knew who would fill this bill was Dr. Cali. Dr. Cali accepted the position and began teaching courses for the first time. His first class was Introduction to Safety.

Dr. Cali was elected chairperson of the Allied Health Department at Slippery Rock University in 1993. The Allied Health Department at the time had the following majors: Health Services Administration, Community Health, School Health, Administration of Occupational Health and Safety and Athletic Training. In August of 2010, Safety Management became its own department and took up most of the space in the Strain Safety Building as the number of students enrolled increased. The Safety Management program name has changed over the years; some of the program names included: Administration of Occupational, Health and Safety Management, Safety and Environmental Management, and currently, Safety Management. The program under Dr. Cali's tenure has also grown consistently over the years, starting with 2 faculty members and now reaching 10 (2025). Dr. Cali appreciated the administrative secretaries he had the privilege of working with throughout his career. They included Ms. Marge Sturch, Mrs. Patty Pink, and, currently, Mrs. April Coleman.

Dr. Cali has touched the lives of countless students during his career at Slippery Rock University. He always made time to listen, give advice, and provide words of encouragement. His lectures were always relevant and included "real-life" situations students would encounter in the workplace. Dr. Cali's real-life experiences allowed him to excel in the classroom and create lasting connections with his students.

On behalf of current faculty, friends, students, alums, and colleagues, we are forever grateful for Dr. Cali's dedication to Slippery Rock University and his numerous contributions to the safety profession.

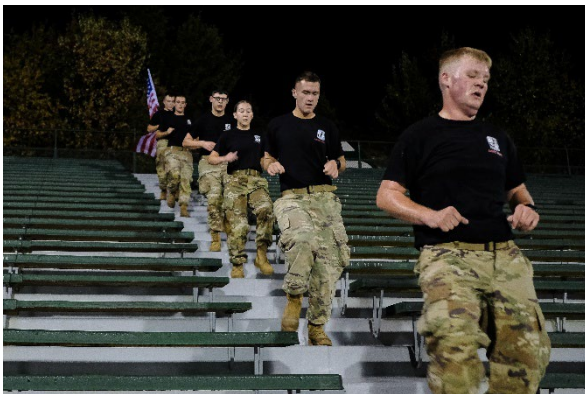

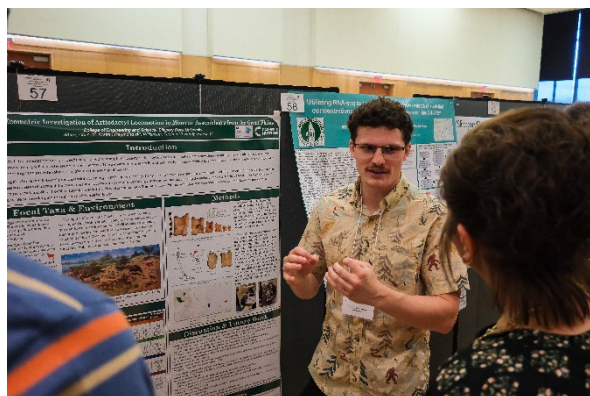
