

International Student Estimated Cost of Attendance 2026-2027



All international applicants that require either an F-1 or J-1 visa for entry to the United States must verify finances. This is not used to determine academic qualification for admission but must be satisfactorily documented for the issuance of the Forms I-20 or DS-2019 that are used to obtain a student visa through the U.S. Consulate.

Applicants must submit a certified original bank statement indicating that sufficient funds in USD are available for the intended length of study OR one full academic year for degree seeking students. If the bank statement is not your own, the sponsor must complete the SRU Financial Affidavit form. Personal Affidavits are NOT acceptable. Below are the estimated costs by degree type.

*SRU offers international students the reduced out-of-state tuition rate valued at ~\$3,996.00 from the full out-of-state tuition rate for non-Pennsylvania residents of \$16,500. A 2.5 cumulative GPA is required to retain this non-need-based financial assistance (eligibility determined by the Office of Student Accounts). Tuition and fees are based upon 15 credits.

[^]The most common room and meal costs are quoted. Students interested in reducing these costs are encouraged to complete the entire admission process early to gain access to less expensive options, as these places are offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

^{**}A 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher is required to retain the Provost Scholarship beyond the first year of study. This award can also be increased by earning a higher GPA while at SRU. For more information visit www.sru.edu/internationaladmissions. **NON-DEGREE SEEKING AND POST BACCALAUREATE** international students are NOT eligible to receive the Provost Scholarship for Global Diversity & Academic Achievement.

Books, supplies, and personal living expenses are not billed by SRU. Actual costs are dependent on a student's personal spending.

First time bachelor seeking international students are required to live on campus. For purposes of estimating room & meals for immigration the average on campus cost is used.
