

## **CCP to SRU – Transfer Credit Guide**

This guide corresponds with the Rock Studies component (general education) of the SRU curricula and provides CCP course suggestions for each area. Because this guide is generic, students should review their CCP course plans with an <u>SRU transfer counselor</u>, as some majors may prescribe specific courses in the categories below.

Those pursuing a Program-to-Program Articulation agreement (P2P) or an individual articulation agreement with CCP should follow that specific associate degree curriculum, not this guide.
