MSCHE mandates that its member institutions meet rigorous and comprehensive standards, which are addressed in the context of the mission of each institution and within the culture of ethical practices and institutional integrity expected of accredited institutions. Expectations are defined through 7 standards and accompanying federal requirements.

4. Federal Financial Aid

Under Title IV of the Higher Education Act, the U.S. government requires colleges to be regionally or nationally accredited in order to receive funding. This means that MSCHE Accreditation gives SRU students access to federal financial aid.
