#### **ABOUT THE PROGRAM**

Advance your career, gain knowledge and skills, earn a Master of Social Work degree with a program-embedded Cognitive Behavioral Therapy Certificate from Slippery Rock University. The SRU Master of Social Work (MSW) program can be completed online or in a hybrid format. The program prepares students to provide social work interventions with diverse populations in a variety of practice settings. SRU's MSW prepares students for a specialized practice in "Advanced Clinical Practice with Children, Adults and Families."

The need for social service managers and clinical social workers has grown by 25% between 2012 and 2022 and will continue to grow faster than average into 2032 according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The national mean annual wage in 2022 for social workers was \$61,420 with social workers in Pennsylvania earning an annual mean wage between \$73,390 and \$83,430. The top 10% of social workers in the United States can earn \$95,560.

SRU Master of Social Work graduates are prepared for clinical practice in a variety of social work settings including mental and behavioral health, substance abuse, medical/hospital, school/ education, forensic/police, veterans/military, aging, and more.

#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Slippery Rock University's Master of Social Work offers flexible options for working professionals along with opportunities to increase specialized clinical skills. The program includes:

- Flexible options for working professionals the MSW can be completed online or for those who thrive in an in-person classroom, the program offers a hybrid option
- Students can complete the 60-credit MSW degree in two-years attending full-time
- Students who have an undergraduate degree in social work and have advanced standing can complete the degree (39 credits) in one calendar year
- Part-time, individualized plans for program completion
- In-person field placement near the student's physical location
- Graduate Certificate in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) obtained simultaneously
- Advanced clinical electives including crisis intervention, grief & loss, forensic social work, and animal-assisted interventions
- An opportunity to earn a certificate in Animal-Assisted Social Work (AASW) with a one-time in-person requirement

#### **ACCREDITATION**

SRU is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. The University's social work programs are accredited by the Council on Social Work Education's (CSWE) Board of Accreditation. Accreditation by CSWE indicates that the SRU MSW program meets or exceeds criteria for the assessment of program quality evaluated through a peer review process. The program has sufficient resources to meet its mission and goals and the Board of Accreditation has verified that the SRU MSW program demonstrates compliance with all sections of the Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards. Accreditation applies to all program sites and program delivery methods of the SRU MSW Program.

#### **LICENSING**

Social workers are eligible for licensure at multiple levels as determined by each state. The purpose of licensing in social work is to protect the public by setting and enforcing standards for social work practice. Graduates of SRU's MSW Program are eligible for licensure. All applicants must submit a completed online graduate application and non-refundable application fee:

- Official undergraduate degree transcript(s) and any graduate
- Two electronic recommendation forms
- Resume
- Personal Statement: Write an essay 1 1/2 2 pages describing yourself and the qualities that will make you an effective social worker; your experiences related to social work; your career goals
