ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Master of Education - Reading Specialist program is designed to promote the development of reading professionals who are prepared to fill a variety of roles in PK-12 school settings. These roles include classroom reading teacher, Title I reading specialist, intervention specialist, developmental study skills specialist, or consultant. All candidates completing this program are eligible to receive Pennsylvania Reading Specialist Certification after achieving a passing score on the Praxis II Reading Specialist exam. The certification is required for all Title I reading teachers in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Teachers can develop expertise in literacy development and instruction, add the PK-12 reading specialist certification to their current teaching certificate, and earn an M.Ed.

Candidates seeking only the certification as a Pennsylvania Reading Specialist (not a master's degree and certification) must complete 21 credits of graduate courses in reading (the CORE courses listed above) and pass the Praxis II Specialty Test in reading. Should a candidate choose to continue his/her studies toward the attainment of a graduate degree, all of the core courses will count toward the Master of Education degree in Reading

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the graduate reading programs must already hold a valid teaching certificate. To be considered for admission to any of the reading programs, the following materials must be submitted with the online graduate application and a non-refundable application fee:

- Official undergraduate degree transcript with an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher and any graduate transcripts.
- A resume indicating the candidate's professional education employment history and current status (student-teaching, tenured, non-tenured; full-time, part-time, substitute) with a school district.
- A copy of the applicant's current teaching certification(s) or a letter from the certifying university indicating that requirements for a teaching certification have been met and that the certification application is currently being processed. This can be from any state.
 NOTE: The reading specialist certification can only be added to an instructional certificate, not an educational specialist certificate.
- Two electronic recommendation forms: two from a professional or one from a professional and one from a faculty member

Applicants who do not meet all of the listed criteria may be offered conditional admission upon recommendation of the graduate coordinator and approval by the director of Graduate Admissions.

CLEARANCES

Clearances are due no later than one (1) week prior to deadline for course registration for each program's practicum/field experience----no student will be permitted to register for their program's practicum and take part in practicum/field experiences without clearances on file at SRU.
