PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

According to the Center for Disease Control, one in every 54 children born today will have an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). The "Autism Epidemic" as it has been characterized by many leading researchers and scientific organizations has led to a significant demand for working professionals that understand Autism. At Slippery Rock University, we have developed a graduate program in Special Education with an Autism emphasis to meet the demands of schools and community agencies that service children and adults with ASD.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

SRU's Autism Program offers:

- Highly specialized courses that address the social and communication needs for children with Autism, an Applied Behavior Analysis course to prepare teachers for academic instruction, and curriculum and program needs for children with ASD
- 100% online program convenient for the working professional
- A flexible curriculum that meets the demands of classroom teachers or human service agency professionals
- Classes taught by professors with an expertise in ABA and Autism Spectrum Disorders
- A curriculum aligned with Council for Exceptional Children (CEC) standards and Pennsylvania Department of Education competencies



M.ED. AUTISM - CURRICULUM (36 CREDITS)

The M.Ed. in Special Education with an emphasis in Autism is an advanced master's degree. It is available only to interested students with an existing undergraduate degree in Special Education or professionals working in human services agencies that support children and adults with Autism (ex. Behavior specialist, wraparound, case manager).

Students may choose a thesis option SPED 800 in place of the practicum under the supervision of a graduate faculty mentor.



CLEARANCES

Clearances are due no later than one (1) week prior to deadline for course registration for each program's practicum/field experience. No student will be permitted to register for the program's practicum and take part in practicum/field experiences without clear clearances on file at SRU.

Students are to send the following by the due date:

- Clear Act 34 Criminal History Record NO record...NONE concerning prohibitive offenses. A meeting headed by the Dean of the College of Education is required if clearances show non-prohibitive offenses. Clearance must be less than one year old at the time of submission
- Clear Act 114 FBI Record Check NO record...NONE concerning prohibitive offenses. A meeting headed by the Dean of the College of Education is required if clearances show non-prohibitive offenses. Clearance must be less than one year old at the time of submission
- Clear Act 151 Child Abuse Background Check NO record...NONE concerning prohibitive offenses. A meeting headed by the Dean of the College of Education is required if clearances show non-prohibitive offenses. Clearance must be less than one year old at the time of submission
- Act 24 Arrest Conviction Report and Certification NO record...NONE concerning prohibitive offenses. A meeting headed by the Dean of the College of Education is required if clearances show non-prohibitive offenses. Students must file an updated Act 24 with SRU if any additional convictions occur while enrolled at SRU

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Are you a classroom teacher interested in improving your knowledge in the area of Autism Spectrum Disorders? If so, read on! According to the Center for Disease Control, one out of every 54 children born today will be diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder. Many of these children are capable of being included in a typical classroom setting with some assistance from a knowledgeable professional. Do you want to be that professional?

SRU's Autism Endorsement Program offers:

- An exclusively online 12-credit program convenient for the working professional educator and can be completed in two semesters
- A highly specialized courses that address the social and communication needs for children with Autism, an Applied Behavior Analysis course to prepare teachers for academic instruction, and curriculum and program needs for children with ASD
- Program approval by the Pennsylvania Department of Education leading to an endorsement on a teaching certificate
- Classes taught by professors with an expertise in ABA and Autism Spectrum Disorders
- A curriculum aligned with CEC standards and Pennsylvania Department of Education competencies

AUTISM ENDORSEMENT CURRICULUM (12 CREDITS)

The Autism Endorsement Program is a program recognized by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. It is available to interested students with an existing undergraduate degree in education (any area) or professionals working in human services agencies that support children and adults with Autism (ex. Behavior Specialist, Wraparound). The program has been developed as a response to the increasing need for highly trained teachers and professionals to work with students diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorders in public and private schools and outside agencies.

The program curriculum is highly specialized with courses that address the social and communication needs for children with Autism, an Applied Behavior Analysis course to prepare teachers for academic instruction, and curriculum and program needs for children with ASD. This program can be completed in two semesters and is exclusively online. Upon completion of the program, educators are eligible to receive the endorsement on their current teaching certification by applying for the endorsement through PDE.

SPED 641: Applied Behavior Analysis/Single Subject Experimental Design

SPED 642: Program Development for Students with ASD

SPED 643: Communication and Social Competency for Students with ASD

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must submit the following materials along with a completed online graduate application and non-refundable application fee:

1. A final official transcript sent directly from the institution that conferred the applicant's undergraduate degree as well as official transcripts from any other undergraduate or graduate coursework completed
2. A copy of your teaching certificate, a PA certificate is not required. If you are not a teaching professional, please notify graduate.admissions@sru.edu so we may adjust your application requirements. Student's without a teacher certification are not eligible for the endorsement
3. Resume
4. Two electronic reference forms: One from a faculty member with knowledge of the applicant's academic abilities and one from a professional reference, i.e. school administrator, teacher, or supervisor with knowledge of the applicant's professional attributes or two from professional references. Recommendations must be on the appropriate forms, which are available electronically at www.sru.edu/graduate, under "Forms"

Unconditional admission may be offered to applicants who submit acceptable credentials as listed above, and who have earned an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher (based on a 4.0 scale). Applicants who do not meet all of the above criteria may be offered conditional admission upon recommendation of the graduate coordinator and approval by the director of Graduate Admissions. Applicants should have their final official transcript forwarded directly to the Office of Graduate Admissions.

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE CERTIFICATION

Special Education: Autism M.Ed. with Endorsement

Program approval by the Pennsylvania Department of Education leading to an endorsement on a teaching certificate.

Autism Endorsement:

Upon completion of the program, educators are eligible to receive the endorsement on their current teaching certificates by applying for the endorsement through PDE.
