ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The master's degree program in Special Education is being offered by one of the oldest Special Education Departments in the United States with a long history of producing top quality special educators in Pennsylvania and across the United States. The faculty who has extensive teaching and administration experience in the field has developed an award-winning online program (put award name here) that can be completed in one calendar year for those with existing teaching credentials or a year-and-a-half for those students seeking initial teaching certification. The online format has been designed for working professionals and busy consumers that want to obtain a degree and teaching credentials without extensive travel and the ability to complete it using a flexible schedule. Courses are set up in both an asynchronous and synchronous manner with most classes being offered in an asynchronous format.

OPTION #1 (FOR CERTIFIED TEACHERS)

Option #1 allows students with existing certification in any area to earn a master's degree and to add on a Special Education PK-12 certification to their existing teaching credentials. This program is offered exclusively online and can be completed in one calendar year. Students who choose this option will be required to complete 36 credits to earn an M.Ed. in Special Education and will be required to take and pass Praxis 5354 Special Education Core Knowledge and Application to add on the PK-12 Special Education Certification to their existing teaching license.

OPTION #2 (FOR STUDENTS SEEKING AN INITIAL CERTIFICATION)

Option #2 is appropriate for students interested in a career change. Choosing this option will result in a master's degree in special education and initial certification in Special Education PK-12. Because it is a program offering initial certification, the curriculum can be completed in 1.5 years including a 15-week student teaching experience. This program is ideal for candidates seeking a career change. All student teaching experiences must be completed in the state of Pennsylvania.

- Two electronic recommendation forms: two from professionals in the field or one from a professional in the field and one from a faculty member from your previous school
- Official undergraduate degree transcripts and any graduate transcripts

- Candidates with an existing undergraduate or graduate degree in an area other than education and who do not possess a current teaching certification, must complete both Practicum 648 and Student Teaching 701.
