PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The School Supervision Program is a program that focuses on preparing students who want to become supervisors of special education. Students examine best practices literature regarding the professional knowledge, skills, and disposition required of leaders in education. They will inquire into major contemporary theories and practices of leadership for organizing educational communities, designing management processes and procedures, and forming collaborative relationships within the community.

This program is presented as a collaborative effort between the Department of Special Education and the Department of Secondary Education/Foundations of Education. Faculty are committed to implementing a professional model for the preparation of educational leaders that complies with current curriculum guidelines proposed by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) and the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must submit the following materials along with a completed online graduate application and non-refundable application fee:

1. Official undergraduate degree transcript(s) and any graduate transcripts
2. Copy of teaching certification, a PA certificate is not required
3. Resume
4. Two electronic recommendation forms: One from a faculty member with knowledge of the applicant's academic abilities and one from a professional reference, i.e. school administrator, teacher, or supervisor with knowledge of the applicant's professional attributes or two from professional references.
5. Unconditional admission may be offered to applicants who submit acceptable credentials as listed above, and who have earned an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher (based on a 4.0 scale). Applicants who do not meet all of the above criteria may be offered conditional admission upon recommendation of the graduate coordinator and approval by the director of Graduate Admissions.

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE CERTIFICATION

School Supervision, Post-Master's Certification

In order to be eligible for Pennsylvania certification in School Supervision candidates must complete an approved program and have at least five years teaching experience in special education.

CLEARANCES

Clearances are due no later than one (1) week prior to deadline for course registration for each program's practicum/field experience-----no student will be permitted to register for their program's practicum and take part in practicum/field experiences without clearances on file at SRU.
