The Written Literate Practice certificate allows students who may not have time to pursue Slippery Rock University's Master of Arts degree to earn a credential that advances their career prospects and develops their talents.

The Written Literate Practice certificate can also be applied to the Master of Arts degree in Languages, Literatures, Cultures and Writing (LLCW), formerly English, if students later decide to complete remaining course requirements.
