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Pathways to Certification – Basic Track Only – Pathway is for completion of the 36-credit master's program. Any assigned prerequisite courses would be additional courses that need to be taken.

Typical one-year pathway to teacher certification

Summer: 4 classes (12 credits)

Fall: SEFE 677 Field Experience plus 3 classes (12 credits)

Winter: 1 class (3 credits)

Spring: SEFE 701 Student Teaching (9 credits)

Typical two-year pathway to teacher certification

Fall year 1: 3 classes (9 credits)

Spring year 1: SEFE 677 Field Experience plus 2 classes (9 credits)

Fall year 2: 3 classes (9 credits)

Spring year 2: Student Teaching (9 credits)

Prerequisite courses – Applicable only for students who have prerequisite courses assigned. Class format varies between online and in person by semester
