Medical Technology is a clinical laboratory science related to the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of disease. Medical Technologists perform routine and complex analysis, often utilizing sophisticated biomedical interpretation. They are responsible for the accuracy of their results and are expected to correlate independent test results and physiological conditions.
