Are you empathetic, caring, kind and patient? If you enjoy helping others, consider becoming a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA). BCBA's can support all persons with exceptionalities and have been instrumental in the support of persons having autism spectrum disorders. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment for behavior analysts continues to grow rapidly, and the overall rate is expected to continue to grow much faster than the average for all other helping professions.

In education, behavior analysts support a variety of individuals including parents, guidance counselors, healthcare providers, and others to provide evidenced-based assessment and behavior-based interventions. The focus is on the learning environment and teacher behavior as the primary methods to proactively address behavioral challenges. Behavioral analysts also contribute to classroom and schoolwide Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS). Areas of practice also include autism, community based mental health, social work, and counseling.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must submit the following materials along with a completed online graduate application and non-refundable application fee:

- 1. Official undergraduate degree transcript(s) and any graduate transcripts.
- 2. Copy of teacher certification (if applicable)
- 3. Resume
- 4. Two electronic recommendation forms: two professional references or one academic reference from a former or current college or university faculty member with knowledge of the applicant's academic abilities and one professional reference from a school administrator, teacher, or supervisor with knowledge of the applicant's professional attributes.

Unconditional admission may be offered to applicants who submit acceptable credentials as listed above, and who have earned an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher (based on a 4.0 scale).

Applicants who do not meet all the above criteria may be offered conditional admission upon recommendation of the graduate coordinator and approval by the Director of Graduate Admissions. Applicants should have their final official transcripts forwarded directly to the Office of Graduate Admissions.
