CRIMINOLOGY AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE AT SRU

The Criminology and Criminal Justice curriculum includes classes in criminological theory, policing, courts and adjudication, corrections, research methodology, and justice administration. The broad array of elective courses allows students to explore their specific areas of interests, including: crime and the media, inside-out, sexual violence, white collar crime, criminal investigations, and criminal justice policy.

WHY CHOOSE CRIMINOLOGY AND CRIMINAL **JUSTICE AT SRU?**

- **1. Learn outside of the classroom:** Students have the opportunity to learn outside of the classroom through our study-abroad program and Inside-Out class, which is a class students take with inmates in prison.
- 2. Hands-on experience: Students use our crime lab to apply their knowledge in the areas of criminal investigations, police response to crime scenes, and role-playing scenarios.
- 3. Activities: Students can actively participate in the student-run CRIM Club, take part in prison tours and other field trips, hear quest speakers and network with practitioners ad professionals in the field.
- **4. Support and guidance:** Each student is assigned a faculty member as their academic adviser who will mentor and guide them through the program and assist with career planning.
- **5. Small class sizes:** The average class size is 33, providing students with the opportunity to get to know their professors, receive individualized instruction, and participate in small group exercises.
- **6. Faculty-student research:** Students have the opportunity to work on various research projects with faculty members as well as presenting their research at local, state, and national conferences.
- 7. Experienced faculty: Students are taught by full-time faculty members, not graduate assistants. Our faculty have received the highest degrees in their disciplines and bring real-life examples and research and/or practitioner knowledge to enhance the learning experience.
- **8. Preparation:** The department offers several workshops that will enhance students' skills and competitiveness when applying for jobs in the field (e.g.; police academy prep workshop, interviewing skills, etc).
