What is My Rock Audit?

My Rock Audit provides you with an easy to understand, clearly defined pathway toward degree completion. My Rock Audit is a summary of degree requirements merged with your academic record that provides a real-time assessment of your progress toward graduation. The audit is organized in blocks of requirements. Examples include degree, rock studies, and major requirements. My Rock Audit is the official list of all requirements for graduation.

Accessing My Rock Audit


As a student, you have several options in which to access your My Rock Audit through the MySRU portal:

- Choose Step 2 under the Registration Tab, or
- Choose 'My Rock Audit' on the Academics Tab under the My Rock Audit Portlet, or
- Choose 'My Rock Audit' from the left menu under your picture.

Note: Be sure to unblock pop-ups in your browser or you may receive a blank screen.

My Rock Audit Overview

Student Header Information



Student header information includes Student ID, Name, Degree, Level, Classification, Major, Minor, College, Academic Standing, Department, Graduation Terms, Total Credits Earned, Overall GPA, Degree Status, and Advisor(s). If a field does not apply to you, the field does not appear on your audit (i.e., if you do not have a Minor, the Minor field is not included in your student information).

If you have **multiple majors** with the same degree, the majors are reflected in the audit for that degree. However, if you have **multiple majors with different degrees**, click the Degree dropdown box and select the degree you wish to display.

The **Date Refreshed** displays the date and time on which the audit was last updated. SRU has dynamic refresh, so each time an audit runs it automatically refreshes with your most recent academic information. However, if an audit is kept on the computer screen and a change has been made to your academic record, refresh your web browser to display updated information.

To **Print** Or **Save as PDF**, click the print icon near the top, right-hand side of the header. This opens a Choose dimension box. Adjust the PDF dimensions, if desired, and click Open PDF. You can now download the PDF or print the file.

Class History is a semester-by-semester list of courses with GPA information. This is similar to an unofficial transcript. Any transfer or credit by exam coursework is located at the top of the list. Class History can be obtained by select the vertical ellipsis at the near the top, right-hand side of the header.

- Prerequisite -- This symbol indicates the course has a prerequisite. Clicking on the course opens a window listing the course description and prerequisite needed.
- (R) Repeated class -- This symbol indicates a course is in-progress and being repeated. Once the in-progress course has been graded, the indicator disappears.



Disclaimer

The degree audit is designed to assist you in planning your progress toward the completion of your degree requirements. It reflects your current term enrollment and future term registration. Every effort has been made to ensure its accuracy; however, you have the responsibility to know and meet the requirements necessary for your degree. First and foremost, all undergraduate students must have at least 120 earned credits (123 credits if you took ACSD 110). Please contact your advisor with any questions or for assistance in interpreting the degree audit. Students must apply to graduate through their MySRU and must be submitted by the following deadlines: December graduation apply by October 1; Winter graduation apply via paper application to Academic Records by December 1; May graduation apply by March 1; Summer graduation apply by June 15.

Block Information

Degree Block Sample: Summary of all requirements for the degree. The indicator next to the block name shows this block is complete. A indicates a requirement is complete. The indicates that a requirement is in-progress. A indicates that the requirement has not been met. Each requirement displayed in this block contains a link to the section of the audit where the full requirements (courses and/or non-course requirements) are displayed.



University Requirements Blocks: Summary of University requirements needed for graduation.






Sample Rock Studies Block






NOTE: Clicking the course subject/number of a "Still Needed" course opens a window that displays the course description, including prerequisites. If the course is currently scheduled to be offered, this window will also display section offering details.




Major Block: Major requirements display in this block. The major GPA displays under the name of the major in addition to the catalog year you entered the major, total credits required, and the total credits applied toward the major.




Minor Block: If you have declared a minor, the requirements display in the minor block. The minor GPA displays under the name of the minor in addition to the catalog year you declared the minor, the total credits required, and the total credits applied toward the minor.




Electives: Coursework that does not fulfill any of the specific course requirements in the audit. These courses count in total credits applied in the degree block.



Courses Repeated/Not Successfully Completed: Coursework with a grade that does not qualify to count toward the degree appears here (W, F, NC, etc.)



In-progress: Current or future term coursework is displayed in this block, in addition to appearing in the correct requirement block.



Exceptions: View exceptions entered on the audit.



Notes: View notes entered on the audit.

What If Audits: Displays the results of a proposed program change using your current class history. Select the What-If criteria for the scenario proposed, and then click the Process What-If button to view the results of the audit.

Future Classes: Provides audit results for courses in which you plan to register for in future terms. Enter the subject and number of the planned course and click **Add**. A list of future classes is listed at the bottom of this box. Once all desired Future Courses are entered, click **Process** to view the results.
