#### ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Leadership is arguably the most critical factor in achieving excellence in higher education. Slippery Rock University's (SRU) Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership and Administration is designed to produce executive leaders that are capable of managing the growing complexities and demands of education.

The program addresses the development of knowledge, skills, and dispositions required to effectively lead an institution by establishing an organizational vision, creating and implementing a strategic plan, exercising shared governance, and engaging in effective decision making. Students will learn and apply leading edge approaches in such areas as data analytics, finance, budgeting, enrollment management, marketing, management, fundraising, and the development of the inner strengths of leaders.

This program has two areas of emphasis that students can select for a concentration:

- Higher Education Concentration (15 credits)
- Administrative Studies and Policy Concentration (15 credits)

The Higher Education emphasis offers a holistic approach that will prepare leaders for career enhancements that most often entail moving from assistant provost or director to associate provost, associate provost to a dean or provost, and program director to associate vice-president.

The Administrative Studies and Policy emphasis offers public school educators the skills that will enrich their leadership skills in public school settings. Moreover, this program can lead to Pennsylvania principal certification."

SRU's Ed.D. in Educational Leadership and Administration consists of 60 credits and will be delivered fully online. Courses will be taught online during the fall, winter, spring, and summer semesters. In addition, the dissertation seminar will be made available face-to-face as an option for students desiring such a format. Students will receive online synchronous advisement (e.g., webinar, telephone and/or video conferencing). The program will be offered part-time.

## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

All applicants must submit the following materials along with the completed online application form and a non-refundable application fee of \$35.00:

- 1. Official transcripts undergraduate and graduate degree transcripts
- 2. A degree in education or documented work experience in the field of education
- 3. GPA requirements undergraduate GPA of a 3.0, and graduate degree with a 3.5 or higher
  - If GPA requirements are not met, students will need to submit GRE scores at or above the 50th percentile and maintain a 3.50 GPA in the first 12 hours of coursework
- 4. Resume
- 5. Personal Statement 300-500 word essay indicating, "How earning an Ed.D. in Educational Leadership and Administration will transform you intellectually and professionally." You should also include a statement on your Philosophy of Education
- Two letters of recommendation (references who can articulate the applicant's academic background)
